Hospice care is based on a simple idea – that the person is more than the illness. The essential care provided by St. Gemma's nurses is the glue which holds together the Hospice as a whole, complementing and underpinning its range of other services. To a St. Gemma's nurse, every day for every patient is precious and matters. The hard work, dedication and compassion shown by our nursing team is highly valued by all who come into contact with the Hospice.

St. Gemma's team of dedicated nursing staff function in different ways throughout the Hospice and the local community. The staff nurses on our two In-Patient wards provide skilled nursing care around the clock to hundreds of people every year, including symptom control and pain relief, making patients as comfortable and pain free as possible. Our team of St. Gemma's community nurses make visits to patients who wish to remain in their own homes for as long as possible, providing practical and emotional support not only to the patients themselves but entire families struggling to come to terms with the changing needs of a loved one. Within the Day Hospice, St.

Gemma's nurses are able to welcome 12 patients each day, allowing them to sustain an improved quality of life whilst living in their own homes. The nurses create a unique opportunity for socialising and enjoying activities such as art therapy with others sharing some of the same experiences.

The photograph above shows one of our dedicated nursing team. She is pictured with one of our state of the art profiling beds which have been available to all of our in-patients for the last two years, affording them more comfort and manoeuvrability than conventional beds. Whilst every aspect of our work is important, it is our in-patient unit where patients receive the most intensive of care which is the most costly part of the services we provide. All the care that St. Gemma's offers is free of charge to patients and their families, so we really do rely on your support to help us raise over £6.5 million each year to provide these services.

Occupational Therapy at St. Gemma's

At St. Gemma's, patients are cared for in many different ways and in a holistic manner. One of the important therapies that the Hospice uses to promote independence and dignity is occupational therapy.

The purpose of occupational therapy is to assist patients with the activities of daily living. For instance, the occupational therapist may see patients who experience difficulty getting washed, bathed and dressed, may struggle with shopping, cleaning, household chores or transfers off a chair, bed or bath, or need assistance to continue with leisure activities or hobbies. The occupational therapist will also help any patients who experience anxiety, fatigue or breathlessness as a consequence of their illness.

As part of the Day Hospice renovations that will be taking place over the coming months, an additional space for the occupational therapist to provide care will be created. The new Day Hospice and Out-Patients Centre will include a *snoozelen*. A *snoozelen* is a multi-sensory room that can be used by patients and/or their carers as a means of relaxation, stimulation, distraction and pain reduction.

The idea behind the *snoozelen* is that during illness, your world can become smaller and this multi-sensory room allows you to experience, remember and evoke feelings that are outside of that illness. Also, in many cases, the distraction of having your senses heightened, or anything that can occupy your mind can help to ease pain.

The room will include ambient and varying lighting, a range of music and sounds and different textures to touch, amongst other things. A patient is most likely to use the room on their own, or with their carer, for anything from 20 minutes to 1 hour and the room will be altered entirely for the individual's needs, wants and wishes. We imagine that the *snoozelen* will be used predominantly by Day Hospice patients and out-patients, but it is also a service that the Hospice will be able to offer to in-patients and carers and family members.

The new Day Hospice and Out-Patients Centre at St. Gemma's is an opportunity for the Hospice to provide even more services for our patients, their families and carers.

Each year since my parents died I have sponsored lights on the St. Gemma's Hospice Christmas trees in their memory. I always display the card I receive from the Hospice on my hall table and I like to think it reminds not only my family but all our Christmas visitors, that some special people are missing from my life at a time when you feel most emotional about these things.

This year I will have someone else special to remember, to miss and to long to have back in my life for just a few hours. My beautiful friend, Karen lost her long and sometimes painful battle against cancer on December 18th last year. It was just four days after her 41st birthday that she died on the Moors Ward in St. Gemma's.

In some ways I feel as though it isn't my sadness – after all, Karen has a loving husband and two great children. They have lost a wife and a mum, which is so much harder to bear than the loss of a friend. Karen's own mum had to watch her die as did friends who had known her much longer than I had. But I have learnt that grief is like love – it expands to fit the amount of people it touches.

We will all miss Karen in different ways. I remember my tall, capable friend to whom nothing was a problem and everything had potential for fun. I remember our joint family holiday in Florida, the many times we shared a bottle of wine, how she helped me with comfort and childcare when my mum and dad were ill. Karen was sensible and practical and gave good advice, which I miss so much.

So this year, I'll be sponsoring an extra light on the trees at St. Gemma's because friends like Karen are hard to find and I don't think



I'll ever be able to replace her in my life. I'll look at the trees and choose three of the twinkliest lights and imagine they represent my mum, dad and Karen. Being without loved ones is difficult all year round but it is at Christmas that you often need a little something extra to help you cope and that's where Light up a Life at St. Gemma's Hospice can play a part.

World Hospice and Palliative Care Day

World Hospice & Palliative Care Day will be held on 6 October 2007. The purpose of the day is to share hospices' vision to increase availability of hospice and palliative care throughout the world, to raise funds to support and develop those worldwide services and to raise awareness and understanding of the medical, social, practical and spiritual needs of people living with terminal illnesses.

Since 1998 and begun by the Sisters of the Cross & Passion, a strong partnership has developed between St. Gemma's and its 'twin' hospices; Tuzla Clinical Centre and Njega Hospice in Bosnia & Herzegovina. As in the UK, palliative care seems to be a means of creating social cohesion because it touches us all at that place of vulnerability which defies division, our mortality.

Over the past 9 years, those involved in the twinning from St. Gemma's have come to understand that the responses to illness and death are universal and that the differences lie



only in the availability of resources and economic differences. Those visiting St. Gemma's from Bosnia and Herzegovina have come to understand that there are, and will be, continuing challenges.

At a recent visit to the opening of the new education centre, Sr. Brigid Murphy signed a twinning certificate with Tuzla Clinical Centre – a symbol of commitment to sharing good practice and continuing the twinning.

Super 'Super Stuffers'!

Why is St. Gemma's Hospice unique in the way it delivers this newsletter to your door? Well...

- Articles are submitted to the editor by staff and volunteers across the Hospice to ensure that all departments get a chance to tell you what is going on at St. Gemma's.
- The newsletter is designed by our IT Manager, Paul Williment.
- The newsletter is sent to the printers for 24,000 copies to be printed.
- Address labels are printed at the Hospice and then these are taken home, along with boxes of envelopes, by volunteers who stick the labels on the envelopes while they have a spare hour or two, while they're watching TV or while they're listening to the radio.

- Our team of 40 volunteer 'Super Stuffers' arrive on mailing day, are faced with tables piled high with newsletters, envelopes and any leaflets to be inserted and stuff your newsletter into the envelopes all in one day and all without complaint!
- On the same day, volunteers frank the mail, count the envelopes and put them all in mailing trays ready for collection.
- The following day, Royal Mail collect the 24,000 letters and make sure you receive your copy in one piece!

Our 'Super Stuffers' are amazing; mailing day is a hive of activity and chatter and without their hard work four times a year, we would not be able to get the St. Gemma's Hospice newsletter to your door!
